



Contemporary Development of Ukrainian Higher Education



- In 2014 there are 325 higher educational establishments licensed to teach for bachelors and masters degrees comprising 1,72 mln students.
- 1,53 mln students study in state-funded institutions;
- 158 000 students study in 96 private institutions;
- 33,5 students study in 14 municipal institutions.



- Ensures equality of all universities regardless of their form of property.
- Encourages university autonomy through activation of professional potential and self-government.
- Provides favorable environment for extension of private & state cooperation.



- Asserts improvement of inner and external means for education quality.
- Opens more opportunities for international cooperation with foreign partners.
